Topic: Assistance to Palestinian Refugees

1 *The General Assembly Plenary,*

2
3 *Acknowledging* A/RES/302(IV) which established the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine
4 Refugees (UNRWA) in the Near East in order to work with local governments to provide direct relief and support to
5 refugees,

6
7 *Recalling* that many able Member States have pledged monetary support to the UNRWA in their funding crisis ,

8
9 *Reiterating* A/RES/58/91 which addresses the need to increase funding from Member States, continuing the
10 enhancement of educational programs that promote the values of social and health concerns as well as addressing
11 the need for a universal standard in education,

12
13 *Reaffirming* A/RES/51/127 which recommends Member States offer grants and scholarships for higher and
14 vocational education for Palestinian refugees,

15
16 *Restating* the importance of programs such as, Learning for the Empowerment of Palestinians, which focuses on
17 providing refugees with positive educational opportunities,

18
19 *Appreciating* the success of Technical Colleges located in India such as, Jawaharlal Nehru Secondary School for
20 Boys in Abu Dees and Jawaharlal Nehru Secondary School for Girls in Asira Al-Shamaliya, that give refugees skills
21 to succeed in society as well as the working force,

23 1. *Encourages* able Member States to increase funding for UNRWA, by setting proportional and voluntary
24 monetary standards of aid given by each Member States;

26 2. Calls upon Member States to agree on a global education norm that applies to underdeveloped refugee camps,
27 for Palestinian refugees, where there is a lack of basic education rights by implementing programs as *Teachers*
28 *Without Borders* and *Project HOPE* with the support of Member States and the UNRWA;

30 3. *Encourages* able Member States to increase funding for the UNRWA as well as additional educational
31 programs such as LEAP, HOPE, and ANERA, to allow for the creation of secondary education to ensure
32 refugees a higher opportunity by:

34 a. Asking Member States to encourage educational institutions in the adoption of such programs or
35 constitute their own similar programs,

37 b. Providing support for co-op programs overseas, incentivizing international bodies and educational
38 institutions, for the development of Palestinian educational programs promoting international relations,
39 including between Israeli educators and Palestinian students

41 4. *Encourages* a Multilateral Education Exchange Program, to assist the cooperation and bridging of thoughts
42 and worldviews between Israel and Palestine through:
43
44 a. The establishment of a joint country student exchange program, where groups of students will study in
45 harmony, within a safe, neutral Member State;

47 b. The support of the holding of a teacher's conference in a neutral Member State, ensuring the safety of
48 the volunteerteachers as well as facilitating dialogue between them;

50 c. The encouragement of funding to be provided by Member States wishing to see harmony in the Middle
51 East;

53 5. *Urgently* requests support for Palestinian women, children, and the elderly by providing medical treatment,
54 electricity, running water, providing proper housing, and commercial aid, such that consists of clothing,
55 toiletries, food, and educational programs .
